This mix grows well along the front range, western slope, and Wyoming front range, thrives in areas with morning sun, but will tolerate shade. This mix can tolerate dryland situations but requires supplemental water at lower elevations. For best results, plant half in late fall and half in early spring and/or consider planting with our Western Wildflower Mix.

Planting Rate/Acre: 6-12 lbs
Planting Rate/Acre Grass/Wildflower 1-5lbs
